

STATEMENT

On behalf of the Government of Mongolia and the Nuclear Energy Commission and from myself, would like to extend my warm welcome to all the participants coming to Mongolia to take part in the 38th Regional Cooperation Agreement's National Representatives Meeting.

60 years ago Mongolia embarked on nuclear energy and it has been accelerating the sustainable development of the country and is making a huge contribution to increase our national capacity through introducing nuclear technology in socio-economic sectors specially health, food and agriculture, environment, industry, science and technology, energy, geology and mining.

In 2009, the Parliament of Mongolia adopted the "State Policy on the Exploitation of radioactive minerals and peaceful uses of nuclear energy," in which there is important article saying "To encourage and implement consistently through phases the achievements gained in the process of introducing nuclear energy and nuclear technology into the energy, industry, mining, food, agriculture, health, research and other sectors."
