

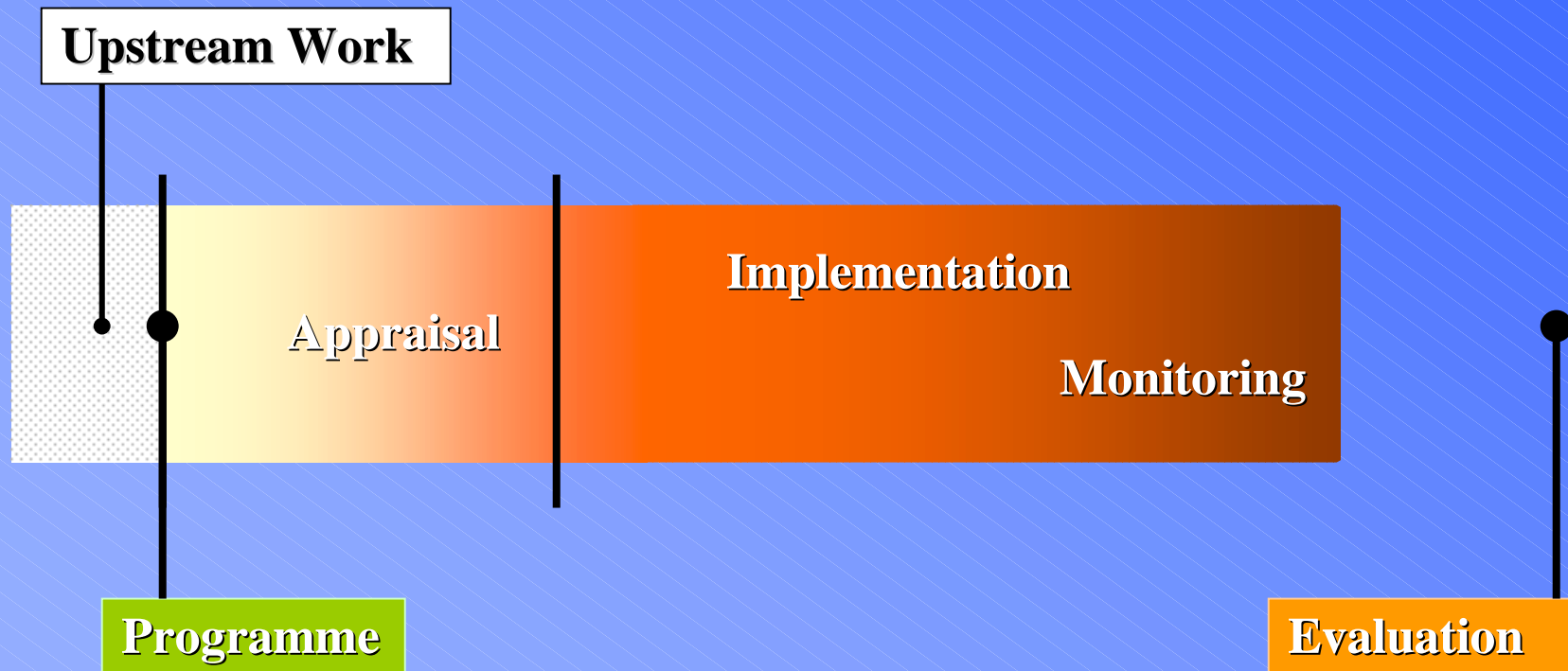

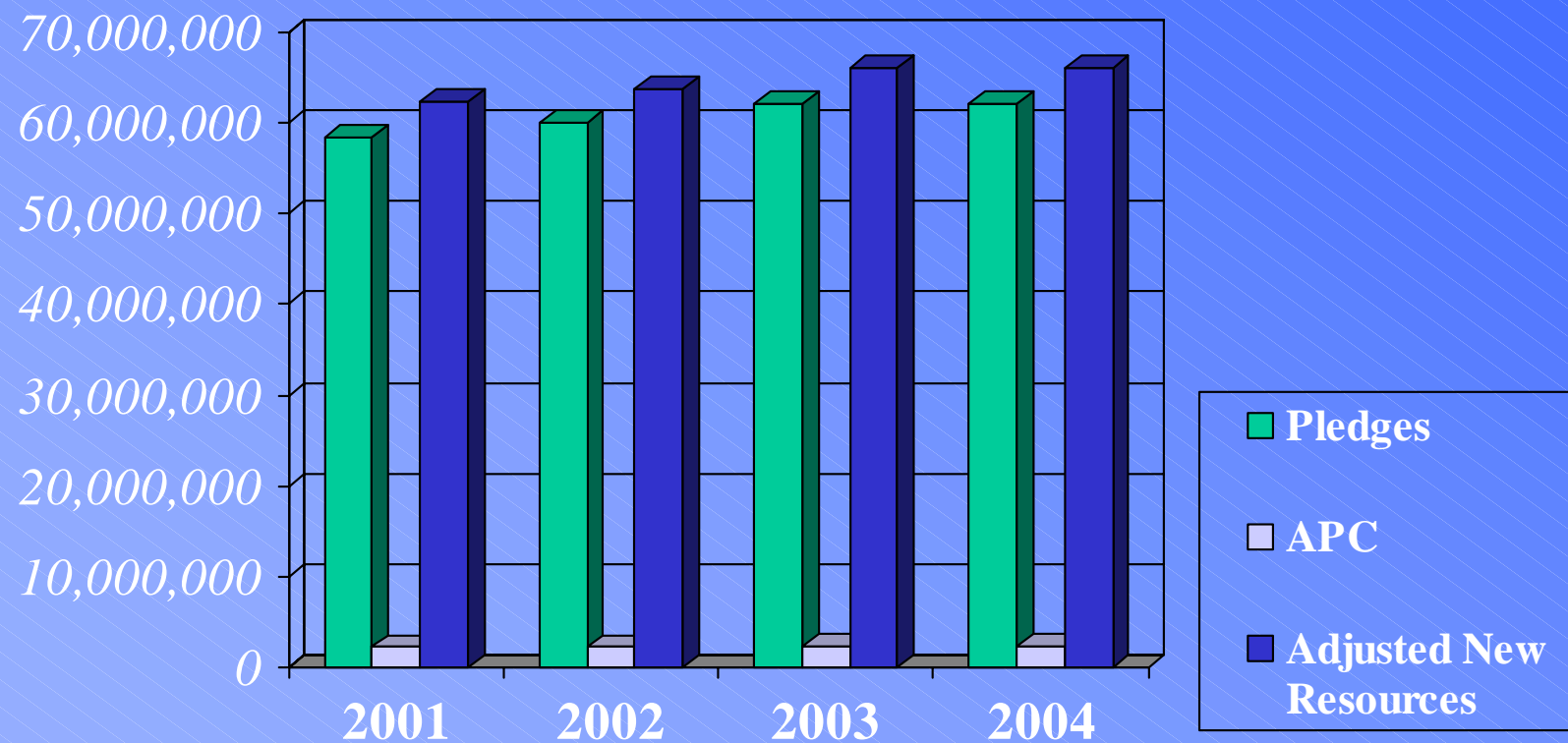

The TC Programme Cycle.



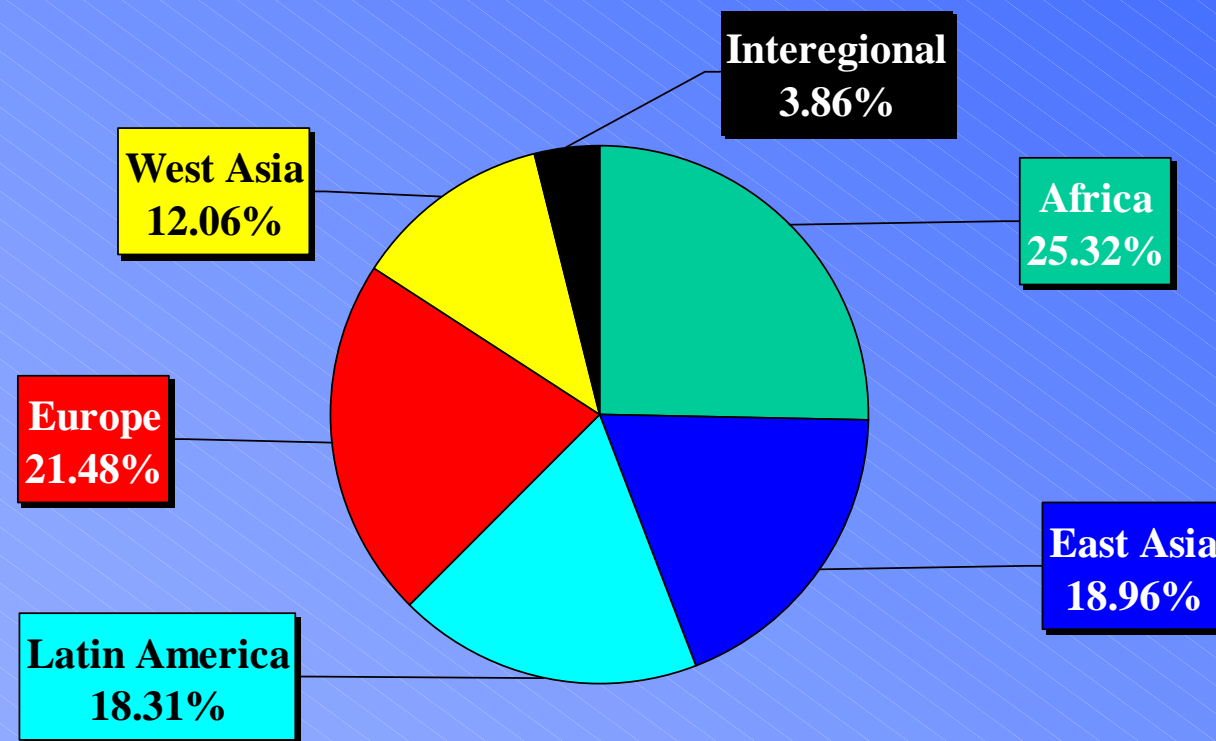

TC Programme Allotments 2001-2004



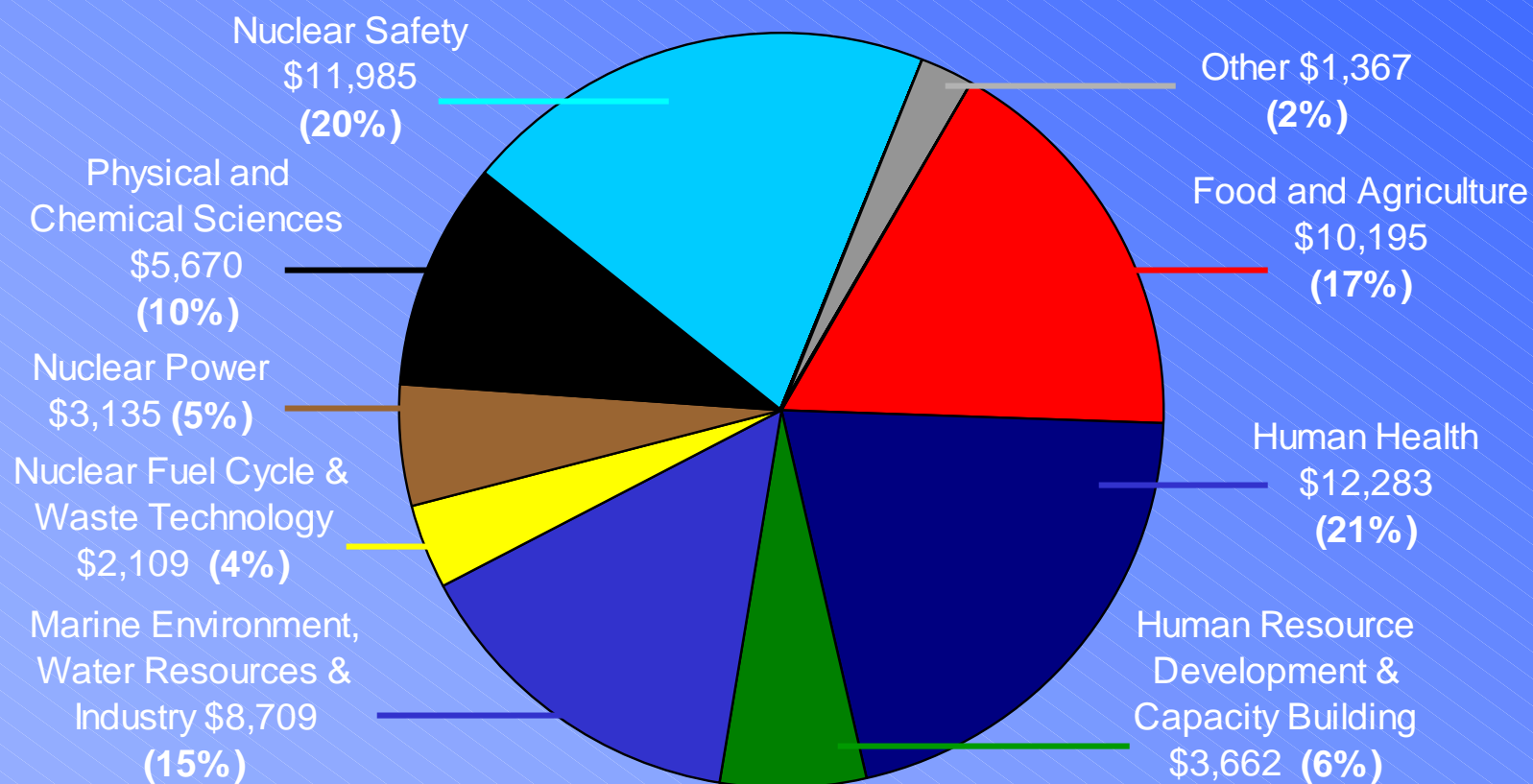

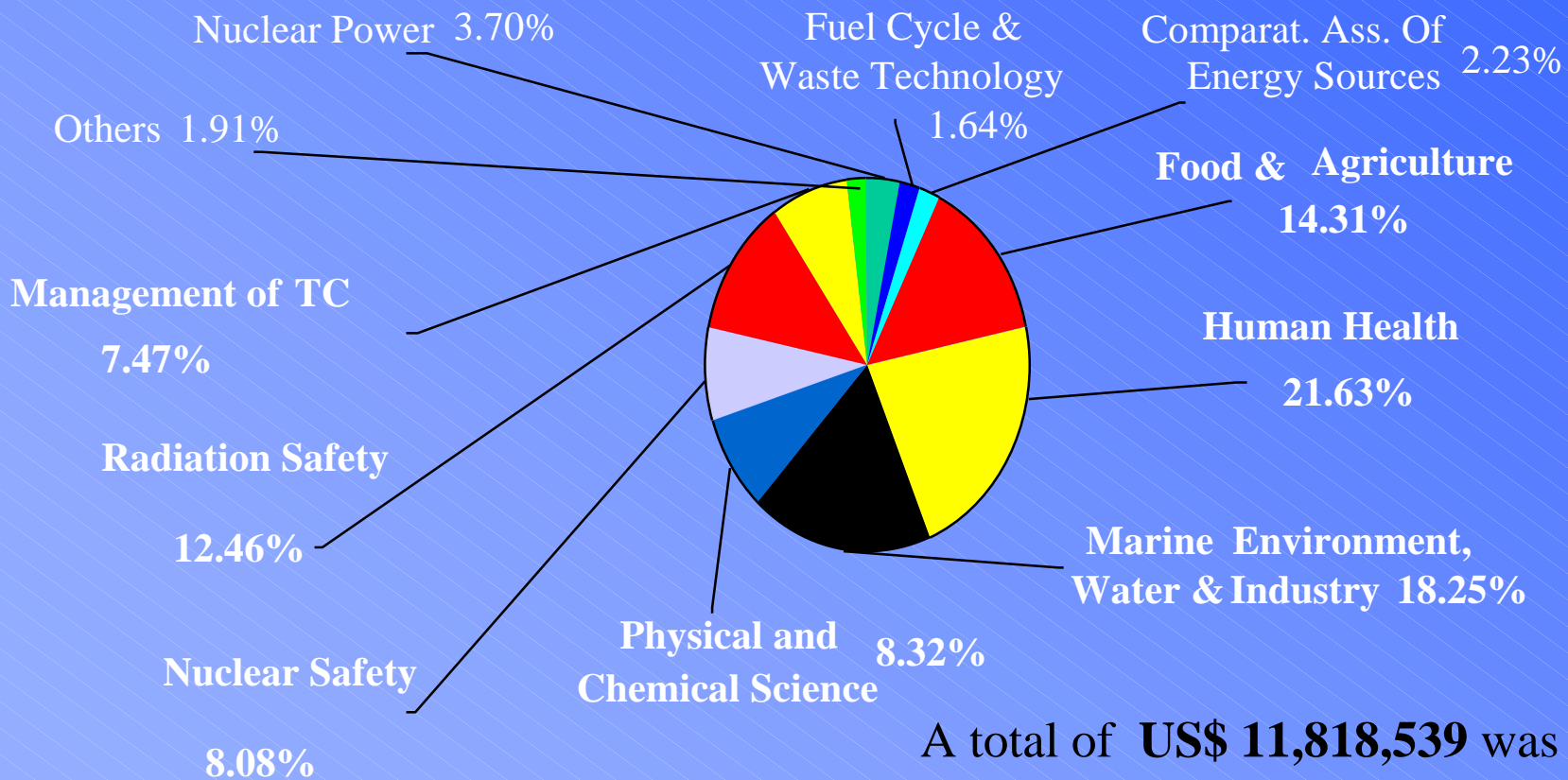
TC Resources Disbursement by Fields: 2000

The Central Criteria.

A project meets the Central Criteria if it can be shown that it is in an area of national priority which which enjoys strong government support. In basic terms this means:

- **It is clearly related to the core competencies of the Agency (e.g. it is safety related or deals with nuclear power or radioactive waste) and it has a good chance of achieving its expected results; or**
- **It is in area where there is a national programme enjoying strong Government commitment with evidence of significant financial support.**

2003-2004 TCP Parameters for the East Asia Region.

- **Allocation:** 12 Million USD per year
- **Distribution**

National	60 %
Regional	40 % out of which
	<i>RCA</i> 50-60 %
	<i>Non-RCA</i> 40-50 %
- **Effectiveness of regional or national projects towards achievement of results and sustainability.**
- **The number of projects (be it new, extension, continuation) funded under TCP does not exceed 5 per country on average.**

What we look for during the appraisal process.

Verify that the proposed project is:

- conform with the Central Criteria
- self-sufficient and sustainable
- having a cost-sharing element

Primary factors for inclusion in the 2003-2004 TCP.

- Accordance with Central Criteria
- Quality of the Project
- Potential for Impact

Main factors for approval of Regional Projects.

- **Linkage to the expressed priorities of MSs, Country Safety Profile, the UNDAFs, Poverty Reduction Strategy paper, Regional Action Plans, etc.**
- **Regional activities supported by International donors (such as ADB)**
- **Solving development problems such as isotope hydrology, providing services or preservation of knowledge.**
- **Contribution to self-sufficiency and sustainable impact**

What you could do.

- **Clarify the national/regional priorities**
- **Provide evidence of Government support at national level**
- **Identify clear objectives**
- **Indicate the expected outputs**
- **Prepare a well-scheduled Workplan**
- **Install a national action plan**
- **Establish Performance Indicators**
- **Fulfil the requirements of the BSS**
