


Primary factors for inclusion in the 2003-2004 TCP.

- **Meeting Central Criterion**
- **Quality of the Project**
- **Potential for Impact**

Central Criterion

- it is *clearly related to the core competencies of the Agency* (e.g. it is safety related or deals with nuclear power or radioactive waste) and it *has a good chance of achieving its expected results*; or
- it is *in an area where there is a national programme enjoying strong government commitment* with evidence of significant financial support.

Well defined objectives

Adequate analysis of problems

Realistic and implementable workplan


Clear In-puts, both at national level and from IAEA, to





Additional Considerations


- **Linkage to International Declaration such as World Food Summit, Poverty Reduction Strategy, Rio Declaration, etc.**







TC Programme Allotments 2001-2004




Distribution of 2001-2002 Core Programme by Region


2003-2004 TCP for the East Asia and the Pacific Region - Parameters .

- **Share: 19% of TCF**
- **Allocation: 12.5 Million USD per year**
- **Distributions**
 - National (14 Member States) 60 %**
 - Regional (RCA & non-RCA) 40 %**
- **Regional and National shares as in the previous cycle**
- **Average Number of National Projects is 5 per country**

What we look for during the appraisal process?

Verify that the proposed project is:


- **conform with the Central Criterion**
- **leading to self-sufficient and sustainable**
- **there is an element of cost-sharing**

What we look for during the appraisal process?

Conform to the Central Criterion

Central Criterion is met when a project:

- 1. directly links to a national programme with significant financial, technical and human resources support as evident of priority and formal government commitment;**



What we look for during the appraisal process (contd)?

Conform to the Central Criterion (contd)

Central Criterion is met when a project:

- 2. directly links to a regional programme with similar commitment from groups of governments or recognized regional organizations;**






