**a. Activities in 2000**

These are the mid term review mission on the joint UNDP/RCA/IAEA project(RAS/97/030) implemented in April/May 2000, the Advisory Group Meeting on health care held in Indonesia on May-June 2000, and the Lead country Meeting on the joint project held in Vienna, Austria in July 2000.*

**(i) Joint UNDP/RCA/IAEA project mid-term review mission**

**(i) Health related projects:**

*(To be presented by INS, Lead Country). The results of the AGM on Health Care will be presented. Health related projects for the 2001/2002 cycle includes: Quality Assurance in Radiation Sterilization of Tissue Graft (extension of RAS/7/008); Nuclear Medicine Applications, (extension of RAS/6/028); Distance Learning in Radiation Oncology RAS/6/033; LDR and HDR Brachytherapy in treating Cervical Cancer; (extension of RAS/6/027); Distance Learning for Nuclear Medical Technologists (continuation of RAS/6/029). Creation of an advisory group on Tissue Banking will be discussed. Additional component on RAS/6/028, on liver cancer will be cited.*

*Health related proposals for 2003/2004 will be mentioned.*

**(ii) Agriculture related projects**

*(To be presented by CPR, Lead Country). The projects proposed for 2001/2002 include: food security, food safety and food trade (use of radiation processing for phytosanitary and quarantine purposes, extension of RAS/5/034); animal reproductivity and animal nutrition, (extension of RAS/5/035); enhanced genetic diversity on rice (continuation of RAS/5/037); and new projects: enhanced genetic diversity of wheat, oil crops and pulses including establishment of germplasm bank; restoration of soil fertility; production of FMD Antigen and Antibody Kits.*

*Two project that had been footnote a/ projects i.e., Monitoring of Pesticide Residues (RAS/5/036) and Improvement of Genetic Diversity in Wheat, Oil Crops and pulses (RAS/5/038) are proposed to be dropped from the RCA programme.*

**(iii) Industry and Environment related projects:**

*(To be presented by IND, Lead Country) The projects in industry for the next project cycle include: NDT (RAS/8/085) and new projects: process optimization in petroleum and chemical industry using combined NDT, tracers and sealed sources; optimization of mineral resources recovery using low activity nucleonic gauges Environment related projects include: Better management of Environment and Industrial Growth (continuation RAS/8/076); Isotopic and Related Techniques to the Assessment of Air Pollution (RAS/8/082); Isotope use in managing and protecting environment (RAS/8/084); New projects include: upgrading of natural polymer utilization; dam safety and dam sustainability; and impacts on environment water resources through isotopic and geochemical techniques.*

**(iv) Energy & Research Reactor/Radioactive Waste Management.**

*(To be presented by KOR, Lead Country) The projects in the next cycle include; the Role of Nuclear Power and other Energy Options in investigating Greenhouse gases emission (extension of RAS/0/028), Improvement Research Reactor Utilization and Operation and utilization (extension of RAS/4/019). Activities proposed under the research reactor school project are planned to be incorporated in RAS/4/019. The proposed extension of RAS/0/028 provides footnote a/ activities on clean development mechanism. The project RAS/4/016 on LILW, still awaits funding to implement the remaining activities in 2001 and the project can be closed*

**(v) Radiation Protection**

*(To be presented by AUL, Lead Country) These include Harmonization of Radiation Protection (continuation of RAS/9/018); Environmental Radiation Monitoring and Regional Database (continuation of RAS/9/024). The results of the Peer review mission on selected MS will be presented and the implications on the programme will be considered.*

(To be presented by the RCA Coordinator) activities will include additional national consultancies and consultations with other regional organizations and preparatory discussions on use of the homepages for the conduct of distance learning materials, and evaluation of training events in RCA. .*
