Background

- **Report of the 1st WGM was presented to the 43rd RCA GCM, which endorsed continuation of the Working Group and approved the scheduling of a 2nd WGM, which should report to the 37th RCA NRM.**
- **The GCM also noted that it was essential to demonstrate that adequate resources can be secured prior to the expansion of the RCARO's role.**

Principle Objectives of the Meeting

- To establish specific criteria and mechanisms for the application and operation of **Supplementary Projects (SPs)** within the **RCA Programme**.
- To establish specific criteria and mechanisms for the application and operation of **Research Programmes (RPs)** within the **RCA Programme**.
- To develop guidelines, procedures and criteria for training/education programmes.

Principle Objectives of the Meeting (continued)

- To prepare a revised RCARO mandate covering the proposed extended RCARO functions for the attention of the NRs.**
- To prepare option papers for the consideration of the NRs on possible funding models to support SPs and RPs implemented by the RCARO.**
- To agree conclusions and recommendations on the proposed extended RCARO functions based on the discussions derived from the meeting and prepare an associated action plan.**

 - **Modes of participation: Contract Holders & Agreement Holders**
- **Evaluation of Proposals**
 - **RCARO(Research Review Committee)**
(RCA PAC would take the role of the RRC with the support of technical experts.)
- **Approval: NRM or GCM**
- **Implementation**
 - **Management: RCARO**
 - **Leading: Chief Scientific Investigators from nominated Research Institutes**

- **Formulation**
 - **Proposal: GP (NR)**
 - **One-off training**
- **Evaluation**
 - **RCA PAC**
 - **Review: SAC**

Revision of the RCARO Mandate & Other Matters

Revision of the RCARO's Mandate

Roles and Responsibilities

- a) Pro-actively seek out opportunities for the RCA to participate in projects being funded by major regional and international donors, including international agencies;
- b) Negotiate and secure funding for RCA projects;
- c) Promote the peaceful uses of nuclear technology to assist in addressing regional and national needs;
- d) Provide enhanced visibility for the RCA at regional and national forums;

Revision of the RCARO's Mandate (continued)

- e) Implement the directives of the RCA Government Parties as agreed upon at the NRMs and GCMs;**
- f) Provide RCA Government Parties with reference to the RCA archived records on the projects, meeting proceedings, guidelines and procedures for undertaking the RCA activities as a repository of knowledge on the RCA Programme; and,**
- g) Manage/implement RCA projects as approved by the GPs.**

Possible Options Funding & Support

- a) **Funding from Government Parties:**
 - **Extrabudgetary donations from GPs to IAEA**
 - **“AFRA Fund” might be considered an example.**
- b) **Funding from the ROK, as the host country, for the RCARO.**
- c) **Funding from regional/international organisations.**
- d) **Government parties’ “in-kind” contribution:**
 - **Including providing cost-free experts to the RCARO for implementation of these projects.**
- e) **Contributions from industries or organisations in the private sector.**

Additional Areas where the RCARO could contribute to the RCA Programme

- a) Provision of **additional managerial support by the RCARO** to assist in the implementation of the RCA programme.

- b) Provision of **assistance to the RCA Chair by the RCARO** in support of the administration of the RCA Programme in areas such as the preparation of the RCA Annual Report, background papers and agenda for the NRM and GCM, etc.

Issues raised by JPN and CPR about the IAEA's role in RCA Projects

- The participation of the IAEA should be a basic condition even when RCA projects are implemented by the fund outside the IAEA.
- Based on these points and the fact that the fast-track mechanism is not fully stipulated in the GOR, more deliberate consideration and definition needs to be whether fast-track mechanism.

WG Conclusion

- Clarification of the RCA Agreement was required in relation to whether projects could proceed as part of RCA Programme, if they did not involve the formal participation of the IAEA.
