1. RCA Programme for year 2000. *The activities for 2000 had been endorsed at the 28<sup>th</sup> RCA GC Meeting. The Meeting will be apprised of the developments under the different sectoral programme areas as well as that of the joint UNDP/RCA/IAEA project. General issues and problems which may arise between the last GC and this Meeting, as well as proposed solutions/resolutions will be mentioned/discussed. A short presentation on the highlights of the RCA 1999 programme will be made.*

**\*\* Note:-** The Inaugural Function and SESSION-I & II will be held at BARC Complex. All the subsequent Sessions will be held at Citizen Hotel, Juhu, Mumbai.

- a. **Environment. UNDP/RCA/IAEA project.** *The status of the project implementation will be briefly presented. Of importance is the support for the 2001/2002 cycle since the UNDP funding is expected to terminate in 2000 but the project continues to 2002. Because of budgetary constraints UNDP cut the budget for 2000 by 20%.*
- b. *The joint UNDP project (RAS 97/030) also addresses the environmental issues, as well as the other related projects under this as follows: RAS 8/076, RAS 8/080, RAS 8/082, RAS 8/083, RAS 8/084, RAS 8/087. The latter 6 projects cover collectively issues in water resources management; marine pollution and coastal environment; air pollution and its trends; and clean and energy-efficient production processes.*
- c. **Health.** *Progress in health-related projects will be presented.. Projects that will continue and/or proposed for extension will be discussed/endorsed.*
- d. **Agriculture.** *The project on phytosanitary measures (RAS 5/034) will be concluded in 2000. Activities on feed supplementation and animal reproduction (RAS 5/035) as well as the genetic diversity on rice project (RAS 5/037) continue beyond 2001.*
- e. **Industry.** *The achievements under this sectoral area will be presented, specially in NDT and radiation technology (RAS8/077), tracers, sealed sources and NCS (RAS 8/086) .*
- f. **Energy & Research Reactor.** *The status of the project on use of agency tools for planning (RAS 0/0-28) will be discussed; the project will close in 2000; activities under research reactor operation and utilization (RAS 4/019) will be mentioned and avoiding overlaps with other agency run projects*
- g. **Radiation Protection.** *The activities for 2000 under RAS 9/018 and RAS 9/024 will be mentioned; major changes include the fielding of expert missions to determine status of the radiation protection programme of other than the 5 model project countries and advanced countries.*
- h. **General.** *Activities under the general categories( RAS/0/025) will also be mentioned as necessary.*
