

### Status of UNDP project RAS/97/030

A presentation was made on projects in the 1999/2000 cycle which were likely to be incorporated into the 2001/2002 cycle.

Specifically the status of the projects under the joint UNDP/RCA/IAEA project RAS/97/030 are as follows:

<u>RAS/8/076</u> This contains the contribution of IAEA and Member States to support activities of the various subprojects under the joint UNDP/RCA/IAEA. Specifically it supports two subprojects for which no UNDP funding was given: access to clean drinking water(1.1) and clean and energy efficient production processes(1.4)	2001	Member States contribution should be clearly earmarked for project activities.
<u>RAS/8/080</u> This is the UNDP funded project to support subprojects on marine coastal environment (1.2) and its pollution; air pollution (1.3) and trends and electronic networking and outreach (2.1)	2000	Possibility of additional support will depend on positive evaluation of the mid-term evaluation mission planned in April 2000. Projects 1.2 and 2.1 have several subcomponents
<u>RAS/8/082</u> This supports the air pollution subproject (1.3)	2001	This has been proposed for extension to 2002. A project document has been submitted on this.
<u>RAS/8/083</u> This supports the marine coastal environment (1.2) subcomponent 3 (on modeling)	2000	This is AUL funded and future support will be sought from AUL.
<u>RAS/8/084</u> This supports access to clean drinking water subproject.	2002	This needs to be reviewed also specially if additional funding will be sought from agency.
<u>RAS/8/087</u> This supports the subproject 1.4, component 1 on agro wastes.	2002	This will be JPN funded. The component on efficiencies could also be taken under the industry projects.
<u>RAS/0/029</u> This supports two components under subproject 2.1(electronic networking and outreach), specifically in the development of distance learning materials on radiation protection and development of emergency response manuals	2000	This is AUL funded. Further support from AUL is being sought
